

Please use and adapt this quiz to get people thinking about who goes hungry, why and what we can do about it. You can also find a youth quiz with extra questions [here](#).

In this quiz, questions 1-4 explore *who* goes hungry; questions 5-7 look at the amount of food that is wasted and questions 8-10 touch on how the food system works and on some of the root causes of hunger.

The message on the cards calls on the Prime Minister to support empowering aid for small-scale farmers, in particular women (links to questions 2, 4, 8 & 9) and for checks on the power of global food companies (links to question 10). The campaign also calls for us to reflect on our own food choices (links to questions 5, 6 & 9).
